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Letter From the Board of Directors


2023 was a year of record growth and accomplishments for Gray Panthers NYC. Our monthly Transformation Tuesday program continues to make great strides in bringing together leading voices from around the country to discuss long-term care. Jack Kupferman, president, and Michelle Arnot, vice president, were invited by the World Health Organization, Geneva, to present and contribute to its long-term care initiative. Carrie Leljedal, board member, was instrumental in the passage of the Illinois Essential Support Persons Law (SB2322).

This year the Board welcomed Melanie Schnuriger as Treasurer, as well as Carrie Leljedal, Long Term Care Family Advocate, and regretfully accepted the resignation of Frances Zainoeddin, UN Representative, who stepped down after 12 impactful years.

In 2024, after more than 15 productive and eventful years as President, Jack Kupferman will assume a newly created role as Chief Catalyst Officer, and hand over the leadership to VP Michelle Arnot who joined in 2021. Brendan Birth, Secretary and Blog Master, and Edith Cresmer will remain as active members. For 2024 GPNYC has set three aspirational goals:

- 1) to develop a long-term care resource Toolkit to accompany the Transformation Tuesday series
- 2) to adapt the UN Sustainable Development Goals into its long term strategy
- 3) to apply to the US Postal Service for a stamp honoring Maggie Kuhn, founder of the Gray Panthers

DC VISIT: In February, Jack Kupferman and Michelle Arnot met with Sen. Ron Wyden (D/OR), longtime Gray Panther and chair of the Senate Finance Committee to present him with the Three Tiered Demonstration Project, a visionary proposal on long term care developed by the Live Oak Project, of which GPNYC is a founding member. Currently this proposal is under review by the US Senate Budget committee.



College wants trained caregivers recognised

LifeCare College and Health Sciences has called on the government and other stakeholders to recognise the important role that trained caregivers play in providing care to vulnerable groups.

President of LifeCare Foundation, Pax Matipwiri, said this during the graduation of 120 caregivers and patient assistants at the institution's campus in Chigumula, Blantyre, on Friday.

Matipwiri said the role of caregivers cannot be overemphasised as many members of vulnerable groups are not receiving adequate care in communities.

"We are happy that the government is now realising the role of caregivers. We are the

only institution in Malawi that is offering this course and we need support," Matipwiri said.

Guest of honour Jack Kupferman, who is President of Gray Panthers in the United States, said caregivers are well positioned to reach out to vulnerable groups such as the elderly.

On her part, Blantyre District Health Office Nursing and Midwifery Officer Modester Mwagomba said health personnel cannot provide healthcare to all vulnerable groups in communities.

"There is a lot that goes into taking care of patients, apart from giving them medicine. And, to this end, caregivers play a great role such as feeding, bathing and providing counselling to vulnerable groups within their communities," Mwagomba said.

Thandi Godoka, who was the overall best student, said she decided to study caregiving to help vulnerable groups enjoy the life experience.


LifeCare Foundation has trained over 600 caregivers since it was established.


Summer interns Sophia Casale, UMass Boston, Nellie Kochnari, The Elliott School of International Affairs, and Breanna Walsh, George Washington University, worked on three sizable projects. For the Stakeholder Group on Ageing committee at the UN, they produced the Voluntary National Review (VNR) analysis, which consists of reports from 39 United Nations country members. This analysis was prepared in anticipation of the High Level Political Forum for Sustainable Development at the United Nations held in July. The review covers how and to what degree older persons were considered (or not) in relation to the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



Sophia organized the Second Annual GPNYC Intern Reunion, which took place on July 13th via Zoom with current interns as well as some from 2013. Interns attended from many parts of the country. "We had a newlywed, a few furry friends, and a couple of graduate students in attendance. Above all so much love was shared among attendees."

Finally, our three interns updated Julie Flanagan's 2016 Legal Services Directory to encompass the legal services currently available within NYC's five boroughs as of August 2023. These services include NYC Department for the Aging (DFTA)-funded, private bar referral, legal clinics and other direct legal services. 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
